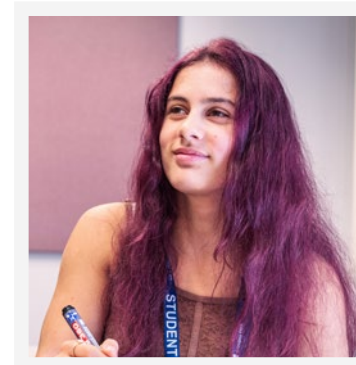
**BRIGANTIA JOURNEYS TO SUCCESS**

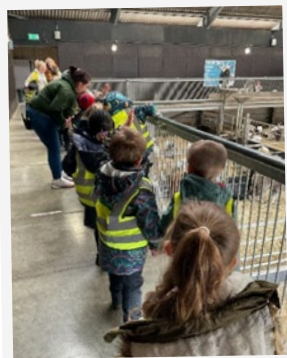
### Wincobank Community Art Exhibition

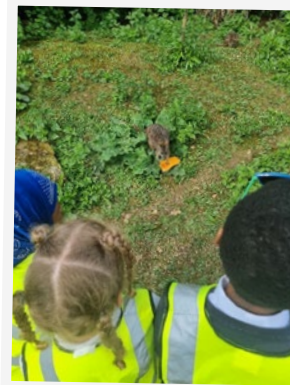
### A Trip to Cannon Hall Farm

**Our IR**

Hinde House Academy's Integrated Resource (IR) opened in February 2024. The IR was established to provide flexible, targeted and individualised support for learners with Special Educational Needs (SEN), specifically those diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), as well as supporting their families.

Our goal is to enable learners to access the mainstream curriculum alongside their peers by providing targeted interventions and in-class support. We are proud to have a purpose-designed sensory room and our plans include immersive learning experiences and emotional regulation activities.







### Trip to the National Holocaust Centre and Museum

An important trip took place this year as our Year 9 students visited the National Holocaust Centre and Museum. Students came away with a deeper understanding of the Holocaust, specifically as a survivor shared his testimony with the students, all of whom said this was most memorable and moving. Our students were respectful throughout, and staff came back expressing pride at how our students had conducted themselves throughout the day.



### Brigantia 8

Rewards are built into the student experience at Yewlands Academy. Each week, a series of prizes are awarded to students: Top 10 in every Year Group, Top 10 Most Improved and Top 50 in the school, alongside celebrating the best performing departments and form groups.
