MEET DR JULIE EDWARDS, CHAIR OF TRUSTEES

Dr Julie Edwards has a wealth of experience and achievements to her name, including receiving a doctorate in Medical Ultrasound. Dr Edwards undertook a National Study on Medical Ultrasound whilst in her role as a Consultant for Public Health England, personally raising £100k for local charities and also assisting the delivery of the Expedition section of The Duke of Edinburgh's Award within a school setting, whilst achieving her own Gold award.

As a member of the Hinde House alumni and with fond memories of her time at the school, Dr Edwards was keen to give back to her community after her retirement, following almost 40 years working for the NHS. In 2000, Dr Edwards joined the Brigantia Learning Trust as a Trustee citing her own great school experience and desire to enable young people to have as good an opportunity as she had.

In September 2024, Dr Edwards was appointed Chair of Trustees, when she shared her admiration for the hard work and efforts of the previous Chair, David Drayson, and the Executive Team. Dr Edwards emphasised the importance of everyone's efforts and the positive changes made to pupils' lives as the motivation for putting herself forward for the role.

Our Travelling Owls

Owl Class investigated different methods of travel in their PE lesson, practicing their skills in hopping, jumping, skipping and running. Pupils teamed up with a partner to travel in the same style but in different directions, racing each other to the finish line – it was great fun!



An Investigation into Science Forces

In Science at Concord Junior Academy, Year 4 children have been learning about forces. Pupils learnt that a force is a push or a pull and carried out a science investigation to research how objects move over different surfaces. It was fantastic to see our pupils so engaged and enjoying the investigation. Their



conclusion was that the car travelled the furthest on the ice as it was the smoothest surface and had the least amount of friction. We can't wait to see what other science experiments we will be taking part in this year.

Fizzing with Maths

Our Year 2 class is participating in a brilliant scheme called Maths Whizz, an online platform that guides pupils through Maths on a tailored learning journey, filling knowledge gaps and continually adapting to their needs and pace of learning. Once a week, pupils are challenged to tackle personalised learning on the computer, participating in games and quizzes and competing against each other to get into



the 'Hall of Fame', in recognition of amazing learning. Well done Year 2 sparklers!

Dictionary Corner

Last term. Year 3 pupils focused on adjectives and explored how they add more detail to their writing. To apply what they had learnt in a real-life context, pupils enjoyed generating adjectives in outdoor learning, and upleveled their word choices by using a thesaurus to find synonyms. An exciting way to incorporate outdoor learning and its benefits in the English curriculum.



Crafting with Clay

At Wincobank, pupils in the Foundation Stage took part in an exciting lesson using clay. Pupils learnt how to mould the clay, using special tools to create indents and attaching clay hair to craft works of art – their faces! Pupils were rightly proud of their work, and it was a fantastic lesson utilising new materials and gaining new skills.



We've Been Framed!

Year 6 used Frames for Learning to create constructive conversation around questions such as 'How would you define the word civilisation?' Pupils discussed

images from Ancient
Greece, Ancient Egypt
and The Stone Age and
recorded their ideas on the
Frames for Learning and
then shared their ideas with
other groups. A fantastic
opportunity for learning!





Trips Back in Time

Year 10 History students had the fantastic opportunity to visit the Imperial War Museum North in Manchester last term. This was an educational day full of interesting and important lessons for our students, engaging with artefacts from all over the world from WW1, WW2, the Cold War, and present day and speaking with soldiers and members of the public about historical wars. Every single student engaged with the exhibitions thoughtfully and responsibly, making thoughtful comments and asking questions sensitively.

Meanwhile, Year 5 had a truly 'vicious' experience, visiting the historic city of Jorvik. Year 5 pupils are learning about the Vikings and ventured to modern day York only to step back into the past at the Jorvik Centre. Pupils travelled around the actual Viking streets (unearthed there) and saw many artefacts while learning about the Vikings. The children got to discuss, explore and handle real Viking weapons (under the supervision of a strict Viking matron!) and experience what it might have been like, all those years ago. An incredible trip enjoyed by all.





Another Year of Fantastic Results

We are proud to share another year of fantastic results with many amazing individual stories of success. We are thrilled that the overall Attainment 8 score is even higher than prepandemic scores, as well as seeing a significant increase in the number of students achieving the higher grades in Maths and English. Results in some of our core subjects have been impressive, with a whopping 13% more students achieving a grade 7+ in English Language compared to pre-pandemic levels.

A huge number of our brilliant students achieved the grades they needed to move on in their chosen pathways. Congratulations to all – your results are a testament to your dedication, strong work ethic and commitment.



Commitment to Quality

In our last newsletter, we shared the fantastic news that the EYFS team at Hinde House was awarded the 'Commitment to Quality' Award - a recognition of our hard work and commitment to high-quality early years education. As a result of this, we were invited by Sheffield City Council to an open event at The Quadrant to showcase what we do to other settings across the city. Our fabulous exhibit received a lot of attention and we secured many bookings for other practitioners to visit our Early Years Team and discover how we implement our spiral curriculum to effectively support communication, language and literacy for all, including multilingual children and those with additional communication needs.





GCSE Results Improve... Again!

We are delighted that for the third consecutive year, Yewlands Academy GCSE results have increased significantly. The core subjects of English Language, Literature, Maths and Science achieved record levels for the academy and Spanish results were incredibly positive, demonstrating the brilliant work of our Languages team. In addition, results in the Humanities are improving rapidly and students have achieved well in a broad range of option subjects. These GCSE results will give our students the platform to succeed in their next level of education or training, and we wish them well as they move onto college, sixth form or apprenticeships.







Go Ape

On Tuesday 24th November our Year 11 Cambridge National Sport Studies students completed the Treetop Adventure Plus course at Go Ape, Sherwood Pines. Fear soon turned to smiles as they spent the day learning how to safely use the equipment and navigate across obstacles to earn their practical grade for the Outdoor Adventurous Activities unit.

Celebrating Success: Outstanding Results at Longley Park Sixth Form Academy

Nearly 400 students at Longley Park Sixth Form Academy celebrated their A Level and Vocational results at the end of summer, achieving an impressive 97% pass rate. Half of all students earned high grades (A*-B/Distinctions), and the academy proudly reported that almost 30 courses achieved a 100% pass rate.

Across the academy, high-grade achievements soared, with almost 600 top grades awarded to our dedicated and talented students. Additionally, students in their first year of the T-Level Education and Childcare course excelled in their exam units, complementing their work placements and preparing them for careers in teaching, social care, and child psychology.

Longley Park students are moving on to exciting futures, with 340 heading to university and others securing competitive apprenticeships and job opportunities.



Students Become Teachers

Exciting times are ahead for our new T Level and Level 2 Early Years students at the Sixth Form! Over the next few weeks, they will begin their placements in local nurseries and primary schools, going out one day a week as part of their course. These placements give students the chance to build valuable practical skills and apply what they've learned in the classroom to real-life settings.
