X1 will run a local charity shoebox style appeal, raising awareness about homelessness and creating care packages for donation. X2 will host a ping pong or badminton tournament to raise funds for charity. Both groups excelled in their Unit 3 Finance mock exam-the best results yet—and must revise over Christmas for the real exam on Monday 13th January at 9am.

Year 2 students completed trial exams for Unit 6 (Principles of Management) and Unit 7 (Business Decision Making) and are now preparing for their real exams on 17th January and 20th January. A revision session for Unit 6 will take place on Saturday 11th January, 10am-2pm.

Level 2 Business students completed their trial Unit 9 Principles of Marketing exam and are revising for the real exam on Friday 10th January at 1:30pm. They are also working on Unit 3 Branding assignments, learning about promotional strategies and creating their own brand pitches.

The A-Level and BTEC Extended Certificate Business group visited Gripple in November, where they explored production facilities, apprenticeships, and graduate roles. Students engaged in site tours, product design challenges, and discussions with SHU alumni about career opportunities.

Level 2 ICT students are finalising their Unit 5 Podcasts and preparing for their Unit 2 Technology Systems exam on 22nd January at 1:30pm. They enjoyed a workshop at the Video Game Museum, creating animated pixel art, with excellent participation.

Level 3 IT Year 1 students attended Sheffield Hallam University workshops on digital forensics and IT business simulations. They've completed mock exams for Unit 2 Databases and are revising for their real exams on 14th and 15th January. An extra revision session will run on Saturday 11th January, 10am-2pm.

Year 2 IT students have multiple exams in January (Units 2, 11, and 14) and should check Edulink for their schedule. Year 2 Computing students achieved excellent Unit 2 and 1 mock results and must prepare for exams on 17th January (1:30pm) and 21st January (9am). Year 1 Computing students participated in a virtual cybersecurity work experience day with AON, earning certificates for their CVs.

Economics students attended the EBEA Conference in November, hearing from authors, Bank of England economists, and undergraduates. The event expanded their understanding of economics and future career pathways.

Year 1 Law students have applied for the Fragomen mentorship scheme and are preparing for January assessments. BTEC Law exams are on 10th January (9am) for Year 1 and 15th January (1:30pm) for Year 2.

Transition to Foundation students have completed their organisation skills unit, independent research projects, and creative self-portraits. They look forward to a celebration event on 19th December, with prizes for positive contributions. **Celebration Evening**

It was wonderful to see Numaan and Hunaida collect their certificates for BTEC IT success. Numaan, now studying Data Science at the University of Sheffield, and Hunaida, pursuing Cybersecurity at Manchester Met, will return in the new year to share their experiences with students.

Eighteen of our A-Level Maths students recently attended the Maths Broadening Horizons event at Sheffield Hallam University. The trip provided an excellent opportunity for the students to engage with the practical side of mathematics. During the event, they listened to insightful talks about how mathematics is a human endeavour and explored the various career paths available to those with a mathematics degree. In addition, the students participated in two interactive workshops focusing on the mathematical modelling cycle and problem-solving techniques. It was a valuable experience that expanded their understanding of how mathematics is applied in real-world scenarios.

Humanilies



In Humanities, Criminology students have completed their 8 hour controlled assessments – all students attended and worked really well throughout their sessions. These assessments are worth 25% of their final grades, and it has been great to see the students taking them so seriously. In History, students have had the opportunity to visit Sheffield University, where they were able to work with some very rare archived material, including a hand written manuscript from the C16th. They also visited the National Civil War Centre in Newark, where they were able to explore the realities of 17th century life through the eyes of people who lived it.

Over the past half term, our Science courses have been very busy. Our second-year A-level students in **Psychology, Chemistry, Biology**, and **Physics** have been preparing for their final exams by sitting trial exams. These practice tests help students identify areas to improve and plan their revision to be ready for summer exams. Our **Level 3 Applied Science** students are also working hard as they prepare for their January exams in Units 1, 5, and 7. Many of them will be revising over the Christmas break to give themselves the best chance of success. Meanwhile, our **Level 2** students are completing final coursework assignments in Biology, Chemistry, and Physics. They are now starting to focus on preparing for their exams at the end of January. We encourage all students to spend time studying independently, both in lessons and at home, to make sure they are fully ready for their assessments. We've also had some exciting trips and activities. During an Industry Insight Day, students took part in virtual work experience, learning valuable skills to prepare for their future careers. An external speaker from First Light Fusion gave a talk about engineering careers and the skills needed for these industries our Physics students visited Sheffield Hallam University, where they carried out hands-on experiments to meet key assessment requirements.

We are proud of all the hard work and commitment our students have shown.We look forward to sharing more of their achievements in the coming months.

Our second-year **T Level** students have begun their formal assessments during their placements, and these are progressing well. These assessments will continue over the next few months, offering students valuable hands-on experience. Meanwhile, our Level 2 and first-year T Level students recently completed their first block week placement of the term, where they made an excellent impression with their host settings.

In **Health and Social Care**, students across all levels are diligently preparing for their January exams, having recently completed their trial exams. Additionally, our second-year students have successfully finished their final placements, marking an important milestone in their studies.

We are very proud of the dedication and progress shown by all our students.

A Level English Literature and English Language students visited Sheffield Hallam University for a degree level taster day. English Literature students explored issues of race and gender in Shakespeare's Othello, while English Language students had a seminar on how artist use regional dialect in song lyrics to express identity and divergence.

These experiences have provided fantastic opportunities for our students to develop their skills and creativity!

UCAS - The tutor team has successfully submitted 260 UCAS applications, and the results have been impressive, with most students receiving one or more offers already. Many have secured successful offers in highly competitive fields such as Nursing, Midwifery, Diagnostic Radiography, Law, and more. This achievement reflects the dedication and hard work of both the students and the tutor team. **Attendance** - We'd like to remind parents of the importance of regular attendance for their young person. While illness is inevitable, it's important to encourage students to be resilient and attend sixth form whenever they can, even if they're not feeling 100%. Consistent attendance helps prevent disruptions in their learning and ensures they stay on track with their studies. We appreciate your support in motivating your child to maintain good attendance, as it plays a key role in their success.

On December 6th, all students were given the opportunity to participate in work experience. We encouraged students to seek and secure in person experiences but for those that were not able to do so, we facilitated access to range of virtual experience platforms. Most significant of these was Springpod. The platform allowed students to engage with employers and experience what its like to work for them. Participation was high, with students commenting that they would use the experience, "in my future studies." Another noted how the experience made them feel, "more confident about applying for jobs."
